Pollution is the New Harpoon: but Pollution Doesn't Just Kill Whales

**Bestselling Author Launches Eco-Thriller *Eye of the Whale*
at 'Watching Whales Saving Whales' Symposium**

Best-selling author Douglas Carlton Abrams will speak about his new eco-thriller *Eye of the Whale* at the Pacific Whale Foundation symposium "Watching Whales Saving Whales." from 2:30 – 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, February 13 at the Westin Maui Resort and Spa in Kaanapali Beach, Maui. The day-long event, which features some of the world's leading whale experts, researchers and authors, is free and open to the public. This will be the first ever symposium in the 30 year history of Festival of the Whale which last year drew 15,000 locals and visitors.

In his talk at the historic center of whaling, Abrams will show how pollution is the new harpoon, but this deadly hazard doesn't just kill whales. He will call attention to the important fact that whales are not yet saved and face a growing range of ecological dangers that threaten all ocean animals and even humans.

Abrams's novel is a fact-based thriller, and the author worked with many of the world's leading marine biologists and eco-toxicologists. He will be presenting some shockingly true facts on which it is based and the unusual connections between them:

- *Childhood cancer is up by 26 percent, making cancer the greatest threat to children*
- *1 in 3 women will develop cancer. 1 in 2 men will develop cancer.*
- *Male fish across the country are developing eggs.*
- *Whales are washing up dead and their bodies are so contaminated that they must be treated like toxic waste.*

What is happening to us? What is happening to our world? Abrams will address these questions and reveal the journey that took him around the world—recording whale behavior and song, meeting modern day whalers, meeting leading eco-toxicologists—as he was researching his novel. He will also share some of the breakthroughs in understanding whale communication that were actually discovered by scientists as he was writing.

He writes fact-based fiction and did extensive research for his new novel working with scientists, recording humpback whales, meeting present-day whalers, and cage-diving with great white sharks. Previously an editor at the University of California Press and HarperCollins, he is the cofounder of Idea Architects, a book and media development agency working with visionary authors.

The Pacific Whale Foundation Symposium "Watching Whales Saving Whales" takes place Saturday, February 13 at the Westin Maui Resort and Spa in Kaanapali Beach, Maui. Parking will be available at the Whaler's Village pay-as-you-park lot. The event is free and open to the public. The day of learning about whales and conservation begins at 8:30 a.m. and continues into the evening, with a Whale Share-athon from 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. during which the public is invited to share photos, video, music, art, poetry or stories about whales and whale watching.
